2016 RETRO SPORTS DAY Friday, June 24th!

"We are looking forward to a sunny day for our annual Sports Day next Friday, June 4th. The theme for the day is RETRO(events that will remind parents of races/competitions they used to do in elementary school). Please remember (event goes rain or shine) to be prepared with sunscreen, water bottles and hats (or rain gear). Teachers have assigned their class into 4 'houses;:- Green, Black, Red and Blue. Students are encouraged to wear the colour of their house in order to earn points as follows: 5 points - T-shirt, 5 points - pants or shorts. We will start the day with a Wheels Parade in the gym, so decorate your bicycles, skateboards, etc. After attendance is taken at 8:36, the parade participants will be called down first and the rest of the school will follow soon after to watch the procession. The parade will take place on the blacktop behind the gym (in the gym if raining). We will start the Sports Day activities at approximately 9:30 out on the field. The grade sevens will again lead the stations, and we want to thank them for their leadership."

Here is the snap shot schedule for the day:

- ✓ Wear your team colour
- ✓ To participate in the Wheels Parade drop off a <u>DECORATED</u> bicycle or skateboard <u>ALONG WITH YOUR HELMETS</u> to the gym when you arrive at school. Participants will be called down after attendance to assemble for the parade. If we have good weather the bikes will parade around the rear parking lot a few times. Students can earn up to 10 points for decorating their bikes/skateboards. If raining, the parade will circle the gym.
- ✓ Stations will begin at 9:30 and continue to 10:30 (recess). Students will come in to their classroom and receive a freezie treat from our PAC (& use the washroom)
- \checkmark 10:50 12:00 stations continue
- ✓ 12 noon free hot dog and drink lunch in classrooms provided by the PAC. Send more food if you wish to supplement the lunch provided.
- √ 12:20 12:40 is free playtime outside
- ✓ 12:45 students come inside for attendance and classroom activities
- \checkmark 1:15 Teams will be called to the gym and move out to the field for special races ,Tug-ofwar, Shoe Toss and clean up competition
- √ 2:15 (approximately) Winners announced and prizes handed out in classroom
- √ 2:30 dismissal
